- **Registration** // Public Registration opened February 15<sup>th</sup> approximately 25,000 passes distributed to date.
- **Housing** // 5,500 hotel rooms secured to date and available in the sub-block, goal of 8,000 on peak. Non-hotel housing being secured including universities, host families, etc.
- **Scholarships** // "Solidarity Fund" with goal of 10,000 passes distributed on scholarship being actively built and targeted to launch in August 2023.
- Programming // The Congress will have eight tracks, including for youth, families, priests, and Spanish speakers. Plenary speakers are contracted and being announced.
- Fundraising // The fundraising campaign is already at 2/3 of the total goal in pledges.
